The Battle for Tops Begins



The National Congress Pairs Commences at the Kelvin Grove Club

The first day of the 64th National Pairs started yesterday with the first two rounds of the Prelims. Today sees the third and final Prelim. The top twenty-two player will compete for the Championship. The remainder will play in tranches of twenty-two. It will be a barometer of twenty-one rounds of four boards. Sverre & Jan Mikkelsen are lying first after two sessions with African Open Teams Silver Medallists, Craig Gower and Alon Apteker (who has two sons playing in this tournament, Noah and Jude) sitting comfortably in second. All others who want to make the Championship final will need to play well today.

Refreshments

The booklet's explanation of Refreshments has been modified. The Pavillion and The Terrace will serve 'meal of the day'. A list of these is available. The Barn (near the entrance) will serve light meals. On Sunday (Mother's Day) only the Pavillion will be available for bridge players. On this day in particular lunch availability will be limited.

A the end of the Prelim Pairs Session Three you are requested to leave the playing area as the room will need to be set up for the Barometer Pairs. There will be an extra half hour for lunch. You will be restarting at 15.30.

Prelim Pairs Session 1

The National Pairs consist of three preliminary rounds to determine who progresses to the Final Three session Barometer. The first twenty-two pairs will play for the Championship, the next twenty-two for the Congress and after that we have tranches of twenty-two for the Plate, President and Vice-President with the remainder fighting it out in the Shield.

After the first session Greg Hingle and Paul Inbona were leading with an impressive 66.65%, Frances Hinden and Graham Osbourne from the UK were lying in third 1.76% behind and the stalwarts of the South African Team, Craig Gower and Alon Apteker were a further two places back on 62.75%. The holders from Sweden Sven-Ake Bjerregaard and Anders Morath were well in contention to retain their title in ninth place on 61.90%.

The deals produced some wild results, we will look at a few of the them and see how some of our leaders fared. This is inspite of the fact that eight of the boards the points were divided 20-20 or 21-19.

A top scores 140.

At Craig and Alon's table the opposition got too high and reached 3♥ which attracted a 'Pairs' double. The contract should always go down but here declarer lost an additional trick, I suspect declarer may well have failed to unblock the king of spades under the ace. However once they had been doubled going one off or two off was a matter of only two matchpoints. So the score was a perfect top 140/0. Our UK visitors took down 3♥ by one but that still scored 124/16.

All four of our featured pairs scored well on this board. Poor East sitting there with a twenty-two count probably heard bidding Pass-Pass-1♦-Double-1♠-Pass-2♣-Double-2♦-Pass-Pass and now produced his third red card and when partner finally squawked to life with a bid of Two Hearts raised him to game. If you have to bid again, and I am not sure you do, then surely 3♥ would be enough. Partner knows by now that you have a strong hand and that if you are willing to go to the three-level when he has promised less than nothing then he will raise to game if he actually has a small something in his hand. Those who reached Four Hearts and there were seventeen of them were slated for a bad score as two off netted North and South 118/22. Our E/W pair scored 20/120 when they stayed in Two Hearts, they made an overtrick which was worth eighteen matchpoints so my premise of not bidding over Two Hearts was at least right on this hand.

If East and West get too involved in the auction they will get their fingers burnt and exactly that happened against two of our intrepid heroes. One pair played in Four Clubs against Frances and Graham—I assume East opened some form of weak minor two-suiter. It might be considered brave at the prevailing vulnerability. Unsurprisingly it was doubled and went for 1700. I think double dummy you can get out for ones less which would have earned you a matchpoint, but marginally better than zero. Our South African Pair were able to play in no-trumps from the South hand, I suspect the bidding went Pass-1♣-3♥-3♠-Pass-3NT-All Pass and on the lead of ace and another heart declarer will take the successful spade finesse and can with relative impunity finesse against East's queen of diamonds and then squeeze him in the minors for a twelfth trick and 136/4.

The local pair had one of their rare bad boards. They did not play in the spade game but languished at the two-level and then compounded the error by only making ten tricks. The question is what to bid with the West hand after an opening One Spade from partner and an overcall of Two Hearts from South. Two Spades is a definite underbid, the value of the ninth spade is so often underrated. A lot depends on your methods but

without a doubt the hand needs an effort, an effort that partner should accept.

Immediately a top back for the local pair after their reverse on the previous deal. If East and West discover their heart fit they can easily get too high and with the way the cards lie it is going to be a debacle. I have no idea what the auction was but somehow the dizzy heights of Six Hearts was reached but it will surprise you to know that the contract was played by South. I will let you into a secret—I am certain it was an incorrect entry into the Bridgmate and the contract was actually Six Spades. This was not a success, the cards being unkind, but had South's red suits been exchanged the contract was not as silly as it looks—you just need the trump suit to play for one loser.

The big hand of the night. All three of our N/S pairs reached a grand slam but only ten out of seventy-one pairs got to the contract. These are the hands where you pre-empts work. What does North do after he hears 3♦-Pass-5♦, I am not sure I have the answer. If East does not pre-empt—and it is not everybody's style to bid with that hand—then it ought to be routine to get to the

grand slam. North shows a strong balanced hand and South transfers to clubs and North finds two aces, simple. Even if the pre-empt is made if East does not bid Five Diamonds there is still time to get to a slam, though whether it would be small or grand is a moot point.

If South opens the bidding with One Spade then you may well arrive in the spade slam, our South African and British pair did. Played by South then you are less likely to get a diamond lead. If you do then you have no option but to take the club finesse and today the bridge gods are with you.
