

## Supplementary Rules for Entry to Trials 2019

### **WBF**

The WBF allows residents of countries to enter its tournaments provided that

- 1) They have been resident in the country for at least 2 years
- 2) They have not represented another country during that time
- 3) This policy is in line with that of the country's ruling Sports Federation

### **SASCOC**

SASCOC did not allow residents to represent South Africa but appear to have changed this rule recently. Although we have received verbal confirmation from several officials of SASCOC that this is the case we have also received confirmation from the same body that this is not so. We hope to resolve this issue once and for all by the end of January but in the meantime we are going ahead on the assumption that residents can enter Trials.

### **SA Residents**

Defined as those holding a South African identity document showing SA resident status.

### **Trials**

The purpose of holding Trials is to select a team to represent South Africa. Players who have no intention of representing this country should they qualify to do so are not eligible to enter.

### **Seniors and Mixed Teams**

The purpose of holding these Trials after the completion of the Open and Women's Trials is to afford those who failed to make either of these teams the opportunity to take a second bite of the cherry. This option however is not open to those who did qualify for the Open or Women's teams.

### **Subsidies**

Players should be aware that apart from the entry fees, the SABF guarantees no financial subsidies for those selected.

### **Venue**

The venue will be determined based on the entries received.
